Christ's love instead of by fear.

us from seeing the world through our

## More than Decoration

I love my home church; it's my local family. But I also enjoy visiting other churches during my travels – seeing other sanctuaries, experiencing other worship styles, meeting other congregations within our extended family.

Not too long ago I had the opportunity to visit St. John's Church just outside St. Louis, MO. The people were welcoming and the teaching was great, but the lesson God sent home with me had to do with... are you ready for this? The building.

My first impression was that the building looked more like a con-

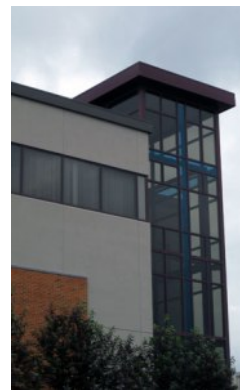
vention center than a church. There was nothing overtly church-like about it. The sanctuary itself was expectantly large, but the thing that struck me the most was the giant wooden cross at the front. Even though it was the largest structure in the room, I almost didn't notice it. It was integrated into the framing of the room in such a way that at first glance it looked like nothing more than a supportive cross beam. *It seems like that should be more prominent*, I thought.

I should have known right then that God had a lesson for me.

It's easy to think of the cross as an important central feature of a church. After all, the cross is the primary symbol of the sacrifice Jesus

made for us. It is a tangible representation of our connection back to God. But in its original form, the cross was never just a symbol. The cross was real. Jesus was real.



Sometimes we hold out the cross as something separate and shiny to be given a place of prominence, and to some extent it is. But Jesus does not want to be merely placed on a shelf to be worshipped from afar. He could have stayed in heaven for that. Instead, Jesus came to us, becoming fully human, so that

## Hymns of Martin Luther

Because of the importance of music in our church services, we will spend this year looking at some of Luther's hymns. We hope that you'll learn a bit about our hymnody and a bit more about Martin Luther.

As the founder of our faith, Martin Luther did a wonderful job of creating a clear picture of the Lutheran belief system through his writings. He was a fairly prolific writer and wanted to share his love of God and God's love for us. He wrote a German Bible translation, letters, commentaries, sermons, and music. He, in fact, wrote over 20 hymns.

As this year progresses, we will highlight Luther's hymns and share some information about the selected hymns.

This month we are highlighting two of Luther's hymns written for the church season of Pentecost. The first of these hymns can be found in our hymnal, #395.



## Come Holy Ghost, God and Lord (Komm, Heiliger Geist, Herre Gott)

Theologically, this chorale is based on the work of the third Person of the Holy Trinity, the Holy Spirit (Ghost), who is expressly celebrated on the Day of Pentecost. Connections to four statements in Luther's meaning of the Third Article of the Apostles' Creed.

*I believe that I cannot by my own reason or strength believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to Him; but the Holy Spirit has called me by the Gospel, enlightened me with His gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.*

"With all Your graces now outpoured on each believer's mind and heart" (stanza 1)  
*In the same way He calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian church on earth,*

*and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.*

"Lord, by the brightness of Your light in holy faith Your Church unite" (stanza 1)  
"Let none but Christ our master be that we in living faith abide, in Him, our Lord, with all our might confide." (stanza 2)

*In this Christian church He daily and richly forgives all my sins and the sins of all believers.*

"From every error keep us free" (stanza 2)

*On the Last Day He will raise me and all the dead, and give eternal life to me and all believers in Christ.*

"That bravely here we may contend, through life and death to You, our Lord, ascend." (stanza 3)

The hymn itself is based on Acts 2: 4 and was published in 1524.

## We Now Implore God the Holy Ghost (Nun bitten wir den heiligen Geist)

This hymn by Luther, appeared in 1524. It is based on

He could live among us. He took our sins upon Himself and nailed them to the cross so that He could live with us. He sent the Holy Spirit so that He could live within us. Jesus and His cross are more than decoration. They are structurally essential.

There is nothing wrong with shiny crosses; it is good to have Christ's cross before us. But what's more important is that we have Christ's cross within us. When others look at us, do they do a double take, suddenly recognizing the reflection of a cross? Within our own lives, do we merely wear the cross as a decoration, or do we cling to it as our main support?



The cross is the support beam in everything we do. Indeed, the cross is more than a decoration. It is functional, structural, and actionable. Thank you, St. John's architect, for that lesson.

*But in your hearts revere Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. (1 Peter 3:15)*

John 16: 13. Luther wanted to emphasize the importance of faith, salvation, and divine guidance and sets this hymn apart from other hymns he wrote that emphasize Christ or God the Father. Each stanza begins with a different description of the Holy Spirit—Light, Love, Comfort, Holy Ghost. The hymn stresses personal faith and salvation. Below is the first verse of each hymn.

### Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord!

Come, Holy Ghost, God and Lord!  
Be all Thy graces now outpoured  
On each believer's mind and heart;  
Thy fervent love to them impart.  
Lord, by the brightness of Thy light  
Thou in the faith dost men unite  
Of every land and every tongue;  
This to Thy praise, O Lord, our God, be sung.

into the role of Interim President of our congregation. He has taken this step with courage and the belief that God will be with him as we move ahead, in this year. We want to take a moment to thank Bob for going over and beyond his responsibilities as Vice President to keep NH on track and keeping our family alive in faith.

As Interim President, Bob has asked that the following information be shared with the congregation, regarding the administration of New Hope business.

We have entered into an administration agreement with the Indiana / Kentucky Synod. This is to give us both time and assistance in getting back on track after the loss of our friend Jim. There will be no cost to New Hope. The plan is to end this agreement on July 1 and once again be solely responsible for our own operation.

1. Bruce Kercheval has agreed to take New Hope on as a client. He will be responsible for handling payroll and tax documents, perhaps more as needed. This will begin when the

Synod Administration Agreement ends.

2. I have asked people to take a more active role in the operation of New Hope. I have been very pleased with the response. We now have readers, message givers, people to serve on the Board of Trustees with the Synod Administration agreement, offers to serve on council, cash offers to get Pastor Candice's back pay situation handled, and a sign. Thank you very much for your dedication to New Hope.
3. There will be more requests for help as there are certain council positions that we are constitutionally required. We will learn more as we move through this process.
4. We are still asking for donations to help pay for the battery and pads for our AED.
5. Thanks to Jenelle for doing double duty for both New Hope and First Presbyterian.


